The School's key partner, Altenburg's Country Gardens, was established in 1964. Altenburg's Country Gardens is three miles east of Wisconsin Rapids in the Grand Rapids Township. Most recently, Altenburg's has focused on growing and selling strawberries in the spring/early summer, through pick-your-own, a farmstand, and wholesale. In the fall, Altenburg's grows and sells pumpkins and hosts Fall Festival activities for families. In the winter, Altenburg's occasionally offers special events such as sleigh rides. The farm is a profitable operation.

The School has the opportunity to enter into a long-term lease with the Altenburg Farm for nominal rent, if it can provide a Lead Farmer and additional labor to work the Farm. The Lead Farmer would be responsible for all farming operations on behalf of the School and overseeing students who will be hired to assist with farm labor, while also participating in the educational aspects of the program. Longtime owner, Harold Altenburg, would provide advice on operation of the farm and ways to build on its current success to develop a self-sustaining operation that also accomplishes a charitable and educational mission.

The School would be responsible for covering the operational expenses of the Farm. Farm operations are profitable enough to provide competitive compensation to the Lead Farmer, consistent with market rates and appropriate to level of experience and expertise.
