We have over 30 years of expertise in facilitating and investing pooled endowed funds that focus on our community. Approximately 96% of the funds we manage were created for specified community non-profit organizations, or designated purposes through contributions for the benefit of the community.

Only about 4% of the funds we administer are considered unrestricted for flexible use. If you don't have a specific purpose in mind, but still want to participate, please consider donating to our unrestricted funds.

Your community benefits by all of us pooling our resources of time, talents and money, to truly make a positive difference where we live.

Many Opportunities to Give

Contributions can be made to existing funds, to establish new funds, or may be designated toward specified purposes like scholarships, endowments to support named organizations, or a field of interest like health or the arts.

The most flexible contributions are given as undesignated, also known as unrestricted, which Incourage is able to utilize for whatever is needed, allowing us the opportunity to address changing needs in our community.



Ways to give include cash or check, credit card, stocks, IRA rollovers, bequests in a will, life insurance, and more.

June 30, 2024, Investment Performance

For the period of January 1 through June 30, 2024, Incourage's endowed portfolio realized a gain of 6.8% after fees, ahead of our peers' median returns.

As of June 30, 2024, the endowed portfolio three-, five-, ten- and twenty-year annualized rates of return were gains of 4.0%, 8.5%, 6.9% and 6.8% after fees, respectively.

Promoting Education & the Love of Animals



Helen's Zoo House Celebration - Wisconsin Rapids

Helen Mead was an active citizen of Wisconsin Rapids who made a difference through her generosity. Helen's love for our community, our children, and for animals inspired her to establish the Helen A. Mead Designated Fund for the Benefit of the Wisconsin Rapids Zoo (the Helen Mead Zoo Fund) at Incourage (previously known as Community Foundation of South Wood County) in 1999. As a result, during the summer of 2000, the first program held was an "Exotic Petting Zoo."

Inspired by a desire to expand learning opportunities and her love of animals, Helen also envisioned a place for indoor educational programs. Incourage worked with the City of Wisconsin Rapids, on behalf of Helen, to construct a pavilion/shelter house at the zoo for the public's benefit. The result was Helen's Zoo House, built through the support of a \$75,000 grant from the Helen Mead Zoo Fund at Incourage and the City of Wisconsin Rapids funding the remaining amount.

Helen's Zoo House was dedicated on June 14, 2007 with a grand opening celebration, where animal educators from the Minnesota Zoomobile presented their first of many programs. With an enclosed shelter house and support from the Helen Mead Zoo Fund, a variety of educational programs continue to be offered free of charge. Recent programs include Animal Quest, Raptor Education Group, Inc. (REGI), and Zoozort, to name a few.

Prior to construction of this facility all programming had to take place outside. But now, attendees are able to enjoy learning from programs within the walls of
